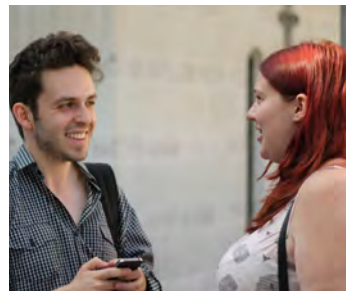

Over 230 young people attended the third annual Freedom Forum at the UCL School of Pharmacy.

They heard talks and presentations from speakers such as IEA Director General **MARK LITTLEWOOD** and Education Director **STEVE DAVIES**, as well as MPs **DOUGLAS CARSWELL** and **STEVE BAKER**, **PROFESSOR RANDY BARNETT** from the US and **PROFESSOR MARK PENNINGTON** from KCL.

This has now become the largest youth political event in the UK, leading to comment in The Economist about the turn of British youth to classical, Gladstonian, liberalism.
